BIG Moves and BIG Changes

According to John Bosch, SabeRex Principal, a published report has stated that a mere 25% of all companies who experience disasters of this magnitude never come back to a healthy business state. SabeRex was back in business the Monday after the Thursday storm hit. Additionally, SabeRex remained on a healthy financial path during this time. This indeed says a lot for them as a company and each individual committed to SabeRex's success.










