Employee 401k Matching Program

The Tyrex Technology Family currently has 47 people taking advantage of the 401k Matching Program. In just 2004, Tyrex contributed a total of \$24,000 to the employees participating in this very advantageous program. In an effort to increase participation, we would like to further explain how the Employee 401k Matching Program works; in hopes of enhancing employee understanding of this wonderful opportunity. The Matching is defined as 100% of the first 1% of the employee's 401k contribution. Examples are listed below to clarify.

Example 1: If the employee makes \$30,000 and is signed up to contribute 10% of set monthly income, the first 1% or \$300 would be matched.

Example 2: If the same employee contributes 1% of their total annual income, their 401k contribution would be \$300. Tyrex will match that \$300 contribution, in effect doubling the employees 401k.





TYREX HAVING FUN

James Scogin of TyRex Services Group, Ltd. and Roland Loera Take the Win in Bass Champs Central Region Competition on Lake Travis!

Spring weather can be ferocious as it was on May 6th throughout Texas. With only two events left for the Central Region Bass Champs anglers (teams of two fisherman per boat), 149 teams converged on a stormy morning at Lake Travis to fish for over \$53,000 in cash and prizes. Action packed thunderstorms howled



through the area during the early morning hours. James Scogin and Roland Loera, lifelong friend of James', braved the weather, the field and the fish to win with more than 17 pounds!



Considering the rain, the wind and most importantly the anglers and their safety, Tournament Directors Chad and Jeff allowed trailering, the opportunity to launch their boat at the ramp of their choice so the anglers could position themselves closer to their fishing holes. Many teams held off getting on the water until the weather broke, and luckily did not have to lose much fishing time. Just before 7:00am the storm pushed through and everyone who had waited out the storm hurried to their spots to catch the rest of the morning bite.

James and Roland brought in 17.84 pounds to win the tournament. "It was a really lucky day for us" James began. "We started out where we had pre-fished on main lake points. On the first pass, we really didn't catch anything. Instead of leaving, we went back and started at a point that we had skipped on the first run. We were there throwing flukes, a soft minnow imitation, and top water baits, lures that float and make noise to generate

strikes. Roland caught our first keeper, and it ended up to be our kicker, their biggest fish weighing in at 7.94 pounds. A little while after that, we caught a four-pounder. We fished that area until around 9:00am, and then set off for the boat docks. We caught about 15 keepers, and culled, replaced some of the smaller catch with larger ones they caught, three different times."

They won the first place package of a Skeeter SX190 powered by a Yamaha 150 motor pictured in the photo above. Being a qualified Skeeter boat owner team, meaning James and Roland were using a three year old Skeeter boat during the competition, they also received a check from Skeeter for \$5,000 as part of their winnings. Their kicker fish having weighed in at 7.94 pounds, won them the Big Bass award giving them an additional \$1,000. This brought their total winnings to a whopping \$35,500 payday! "The night before, at registration, we rubbed the 'lucky rock' a lady had. After the tournament she gave us the rock, and now it's in our boat. It pays to have a lucky rock! I'd also like to say that we really enjoy fishing Bass Champs, and have fished it since the organization started in this region. It's the greatest tournament trail going" said Scogin.
