

DLi Seminar Focuses on Green Technology

DLi Labs hosted a Green Reliability Seminar and Open House on June 8th along with partners DfR and Ops a La Carte. Sixty people attend and another 30 attended via Webinar. DLi conducted lab tours of the facility along with 4 presentations centered on Green technologies and the reliability challenges that they pose.

The lab tours proved popular. Several stations were set up to demonstrate capabilities including an IR camera, a PCB inspection station with a USB microscope camera and a

HALT demonstration with Polycom products.



Seminar topics included "Reliability Challenges in the Green Revolution", "The Green Market of Videoconferencing", "Reliability Challenges for Solar-Microinverters", and "Accelerated Environmental Stress Testing in the PV World". The event was held at the DLi facility at 3201 Industrial Terrace in Austin.


